consistent with the ideals and  
objectives of Rotary  
International. Rotarians may  
nominate individuals or  
organizations involved in local  
or international humanitarian  
efforts. Since 1993, a  
contribution of \$100,000 had  
been donated to support a  
project of the recipient's choice,  
with the approval of the RI  
Board.
