Dr. Lynn Perry, Nohemi Mason, Aubrey Program chair for last week was President Aubrey Weldon. His speakers were Nohemi Beissmann Mason and Dr. Lynn Perry.

Nohemi is the Chair person for Project Copper Canyon in the Novato Rotary Club and works with retired Dr. Lynn Perry on the project. She has been a Rotarian for over 6 years and since retiring from her business in Novato she has been active in helping the children in Mexico. Project Copper Canyon is a humanitarian project to help the Tarahumara Indian children who live in Guachochi Village in the Copper Canyon region. They collect clothes, school supplies, books and games and take to the children. With a matching grant from Rotary International they helped to build better living conditions; provide indoor bathrooms, and a better septic system. Also, they helped them with dental care and healthcare and are focusing on malnutrition assistance. They will help with scholarships in the future.

Project Service Director and International Service Chair Kathryn Baker announced that our Club will join with several other Rotary clubs to help Rotary clubs in Guayaquil, Ecuador sponsor a Micro-Credit Program. A Matching Grant has been approved by the Rotary Foundation. This project will help 300 women set up their own small businesses. This is a Revolving Loan Fund so hundreds of women will be helped by this project. Our members voted to contribute \$750.00 to the project. Village Banks have been highly successful in developing countries throughout the world.

1998 –Dr. Catherine Hamlin of Australia, obstetrician and founding director of the Addis Ababa Fistula Hospital in Ethiopia. Grant project: Addis Ababa Fistula Hospital.

1999- Dr. Muhammad Yunus of Bangladesh, founder of the Grameen Bank (introduced the concept of micro-credit or village banking in developing countries. Grant project: Grameen Foundation USA.

2000 – No award given.

2001 – Dr. Pramod Karan Sethi of India, orthopedic surgeon and inventor of the Jaipur foot. Grant project: Jaipur Limb Training Centers.

2002- Dr. Norman E. Borlaug of the United States, agricultural researcher known as the father of the Green Revolution and 1970 Noble Peace Prize laureate. Grant project: Educational agricultural projects in Iowa, USA, and Mexico.

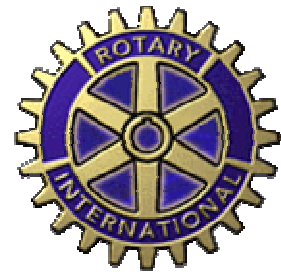
