THE PROGRAM CHAIR FOR THIS WEEK:

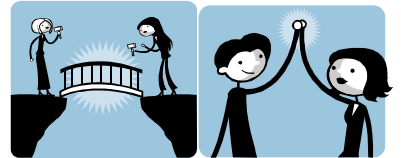

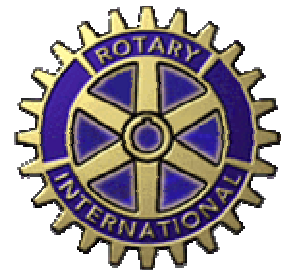
