Program chair for last week was Kathryn Baker. Her speaker was Assistance North County Fire Chief, Prevention Services Bureau, Robert Marshall. His topic was “Emergency Disaster Planning”

for the next major disaster event in the North County. Daly City has over 110,000 residences who speak 26 different dialects and if there is a major disaster the ratio of fireman to resident is about one (1) to every four (4) thousands. That means that the majority of the residence must be prepared to take emergency care for themselves. Therefore, the plan in Daly City focuses on what individual residences need to do for survival. Each resident needs to have a personal plan for the family, prepare a disaster supply kit, and become involved in the community training resource offered by the fire department. The fire department has three levels of training for the residents: (1) is a Risk Assessment program to help identify threats to property and person in home. (2) Community Emergency Response Teams (CERTS)..(3) Training..... (con’t)

ROTARY HISTORY

The Rotary International Convention was held in Havana Cuba, 9-14 June 1940. Over 3,713 attended the convention. Delegates at the convention adopted a resolution calling for “respect for human rights.”

The pioneering document read in part, “Where freedom, justice, truth, sanctity of the pledged word, and respect for human rights to not exist, Rotary cannot live not its ideals prevail.”

This resolution later became a model for the UN’s Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Some of the exact wording even appears in the UN’s version, authored largely by Eleanor Roosevelt!

The delegates also authorized giving \$50,000 for war relief through the Red Cross and voted to establish a Rotary Relief Fund to aid Rotarians and families suffering from the war.

Giving Program. Other Programs include Polio Plus, Polio Plus Partners, Health, Hunger and Humanity Grants, Matching Grants, District Simplified Grants, Individual Grants, Rotary World Peace Scholars, Ambassadorial Scholarships, Rotary Grants for University Teachers, Solidarity in South Asia (tsunami) and Group Study Exchange (GSE). In 2004-2005, the Foundation spent over \$94.5 million dollars on all programs and over \$117.9 million was contributed to the Foundation. Since the Foundations inception over \$1.680 Billion dollars in contributions have been collected.

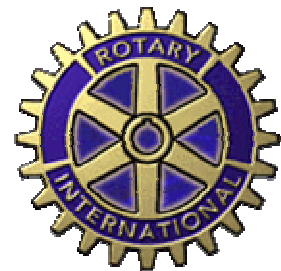
